
Frequently Asked Questions

What does the application process entail?

The application process is an extensive one that takes approximately three months to complete. Sister Maryanne coordinates and goes through the application process with you. It consists of personal, medical, psychological, educational, employment and financial components. The cost of the application process is shared by the Sisters of Charity and you, if possible.



What is the mission of the Sisters of Charity?
